SUMMARY ORDER OF REVOCATION

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537

The above-captioned matter comes on for action by the Kansas Commission on Peace Officers' Standards and Training (Commission) through a summary proceeding under the Kansas Administrative Procedures Act, K.S.A. 77-537, regarding the law enforcement certification of JARED KENDRICK (Respondent).

STATEMENT OF FACTS

1. The Commission issued a full-time law enforcement certification to Respondent, certification number 23894.
2. Respondent was employed as a full-time law enforcement officer with the Overland Park Police Department (OPPD) from June 9, 2008 to July 31, 2020.
3. Respondent took video and photographs of AK while she was in a state of undress without her consent. AK filed a complaint with the OPPD, who opened an investigation. During an interview with the OPPD, Respondent

admitted that while on-duty and responding to calls as an OPPD officer, he picked up a pair of women's underwear from inside a residence and put them in his pocket, picked up a pair of women's underwear and took them, and picked up a pair of women's underwear from inside a vehicle and smelled them before putting them back. Respondent also admitted to picking up dirty laundry belonging to OPPD female officers and sniffing the crotch of the uniform pants.

4. Respondent was criminally charged in the District Court of Johnson County, Case Number 20DV1534. On April 7, 2021, Respondent was convicted of Breach of Privacy, a felony.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

5. Pursuant to K.S.A. 74-5616(b)(1) the Commission may revoke the certification of a police or law enforcement officer who fails to meet and maintain the requirements of K.S.A. 74-5605 or 74-5607a, and amendments thereto.

Felony Conviction

6. K.S.A. 74-5605(b)(3) states that each applicant for certification shall not have been convicted of a crime that would constitute a felony under the laws of this state.
7. Due to his felony conviction in the District Court of Johnson County, Case Number 20DV1534, Respondent fails to meet and maintain the requirements of K.S.A. 74-5605.

Good Moral Character

8. K.S.A. 74-5605(b)(5) states that each applicant for certification shall be of good moral character sufficient to warrant the public trust in the applicant as a police officer or law enforcement officer.

9. K.A.R. 106-2-4(a) defines good moral character as including the personal traits or qualities of integrity, honesty, upholding the laws of the state and nation, conduct that warrants the public trust, and upholding the oath required for certification as specified in K.A.R. 106-3-6.
10. Respondent's conduct shows that he lacks the personal qualities of integrity, honesty, upholding the laws of the state, conduct that warrants the public trust, and upholding the oath required for certification.

Summary Proceedings

11. Under K.S.A. 77-537, the Commission may conduct these summary proceedings, subject to Respondent's request for a hearing. The Commission finds that the use of summary proceedings in these circumstances does not violate any provisions of law and the protection of the public interest does not require the Commission to give notice and opportunity to participate to any person other than Respondent.

ORDER

Based on the Statement of Facts and Conclusions of Law, the Commission orders that the Kansas Law Enforcement Officer Certification of JARED KENDRICK be revoked.

ACCORDINGLY, THE KANSAS COMMISSION ON PEACE OFFICERS' STANDARDS AND TRAINING CERTIFICATE OF JARED KENDRICK IS HEREBY REVOKED.

FURTHER, Respondent is ordered to surrender and return to the Commission all evidence of his certification as a law enforcement officer.

NOTICE OF RELIEF FROM THIS SUMMARY ORDER


